



Blue Sky Bridge is a non-profit organization located in Boulder, Colorado working toward prevention and intervention in the fight against child abuse. We were founded in 1995 and use the Child Advocacy Center (CAC) model to create a child-focused approach to abuse investigations, working closely with investigation and support agencies including law enforcement, social services and the District Attorney's office. Blue Sky Bridge provides skilled forensic interviews of children as well as crisis counseling and support to non-offending caregivers, medical exams for children, trauma-focused therapy for child victims and their caregivers, and presents education programs to increase community awareness and to empower the community to prevent sexual abuse of children.

Education Intern:

Interns work with staff and volunteers to empower students and increase their knowledge about body safety. Interns select one day a week to be available during school hours. When you are assigned to a school you will be presenting an interactive curriculum to students and answering questions they may have. There are also opportunities to briefly talk one on one with interested students after presentations as appropriate to answer questions and reinforce the content of the curriculum.

During time when you are not in schools we may ask for help with collecting, inputting and summarizing data from student surveys or other administrative tasks as needed.

Please note that this position requires access to reliable transportation to get to and from schools. You are able to submit reports for miles driven and Blue Sky Bridge will pay the current IRS rate for mileage.

General Duties

Work in elementary schools in and around Boulder County to deliver the education program to third grade and kindergarten students with fidelity in a culturally-sensitive manner

- Act as support for staff and volunteers at schools
- Assist the education team in preparing materials for schools each month
- Assist the education team in preparing materials and setting up for community trainings
- Collect, input and summarize data from pre/post program measurements

- Act as a substitute presenter in lieu of volunteers when needed
- Other duties as assigned

Required Skills:

- Ability to communicate effectively
- Organized, reliable and efficient
- Enthusiasm and ability to work independently
- Understanding of and commitment to competently working with diverse people and families.
- Knowledge of issues surrounding child abuse/neglect or interest in learning
- Ability to “change gears” and work flexibly
- Experience working with children
- Capacity to maintain confidentiality

Minimum Qualifications: A Bachelor’s Degree or being a student in good standing in a Bachelor’s or Associate Degree program. Willingness to pass a background check and complete all required paperwork for working with the school districts. Access to reliable transportation to be used weekly to get to and from the schools. Bilingual candidates are strongly encouraged to apply.
